1. HB 2044 – would expand Medicaid to provide H.Care for 150,000 more Kansans in need; Allows for Fed. dollars and creates jobs & Eco.Dev;**Support**
2. SB 55 – Petty Amendm't restores local gov't control onfor Wyandotte Cty. on a number of workplace issues including Prevail Wage; **Support**
3. SB 135 – Hensley Amendm't restoring St. Employee Classified Service protections that were removed for rehires, promotions, demotions and X-fers; **Support**

4. HB 2178 – This was a first attempt to override the Gov;s veto of a Tax Structure fix of the disastrous tax cuts handed out to businesses in 2012; **Support**
5. SB 30 – This was the 2nd and successful attempt to override the Gov and repeal regressive tax cuts passed in 2012 that allowed LLC’s to not pay income taxes; This bill also provided “fixes” to phase back in the Home Mortgage deduction and the child and dependent care tax credit; Also, a third tier was returned to the Income Tax structure for income tax and the rate was adjusted; **Support**
6. SB 19 – This bill sets the state on a path to begin to restore school funding deemed “inadequate” by the KS Supreme Ct.; Such underfunding has hurt our educational promise to the children of Kansas families which is in direct conflict with our state constitution;**Support**
7. HB 2002 – This is the Omnibus Budget bill that finally provides raises for most state employees of 2.5% and 5% depending on their last wage adjustm’t; **Support**

*This scorecard is based on what Labor identified as important votes to working families and thus, not all bills passing this chamber became law.

**Not all legislators served the entirety of the 2017 Legislative Session.

***An override of the Governor’s veto of a bill requires a 2/3 vote or 27 yes votes in the Senate chamber.
