No. Issue

- #1 HB 2044 – would expand Medicaid to provide Health Care for 150,000 more Kansans in need; Allows for Federal dollars to flow to the state and is projected to create thousands of new local jobs and Economic Development; **Support**
- #2 SB 55 – Curtis Amendm’t that provides for reinstating local governm’t control to pay wages above minimum wage, benefits and hire responsible bidders of public contracts; **Support**
- #3 HB 2186 – Stogsdill Amendm’t to restore “due-process” rights for Teachers taken away a few years ago in a mid-night legislative session; **Support**
- #4 HB 2186 – Final Action vote on the Arbitration bill that includes the Stogsdill Amendm’t for Teacher due-process; **Support**
- #5 HB 2178 – This was the 1st attempt to override the Gov repealing the irresponsible 2012 tax cuts; Provides fairer tax structure; **Support**
- #6 HB 2044 – This vote was to override the Gov’s veto of the bill to expand Medicaid; Critical to providing H.Care to 150,000 Kansans w/out; **Support**
- #7 SB 30 – 2nd and successful attempt to override the Gov’s veto; It repeals the regressive 2012 tax cuts that allowed LLC’s to not pay income taxes; It also phases back in the Home Mortgage deduction and the child and dependent care tax credit; Returns to 3 Tier Income Tax brackets; **Support**
- #8 SB 19 - The bill sets the state on a path to begin to restore K-12 school funding deemed “inadequate” by the KS Supreme Ct. ; Such underfunding has hurt our educational promise to the children of Kansa families which is in direct conflict with our state constitution; **Support**
- #9 HB 2002 – Omnibus Budget bill that provides raises for most state employees of 2.5% & 5% depending on their last wage adjustm’t; **Support**

#10 HB 2095 - Trucking bill that allows for special permits specific to truck, tractor-trailer combinations, the weight loads and redefines use of "triple axels"; Further, the bill compromises the structural integrity of our highways including bridges; Safety and costs are other issues; **Oppose**
