No. Issue

- #1 HB 2361 Curtis Amendm't that would revert back to the 4th Edition of the AMA Guide from the 6th and use a new schedule of worker injury format giving workers a fairer system of evaluation; **Support**
- #2 HB 2361 Hodge Amendm't; Provides for choice of H.Care Provider (physician) by an injured worker; This is the alternative to having employers choose the Dr. when an employee is injured; **Support**
- #3 HB 2757 Restores "due-process" rights for Teachers taken away a few years ago; Provisions in the bill do so at contract renewal date; **Support**
- #4 SB 109 Omnibus bill that includes important funding to Transp. Projects, St. Emp. Raises/Pension & Agencies; **Support**
- #5 SB 328 Prohibits outsourcing of security in St. Penal institutions & Juvenile Facilities; Provides KP&F to Correctional Officers; Support
- #6 HB 2044 This vote was to oppose the ruling by the rules chair; A ruling to sustain prevailed preventing a vote to expand Medicaid; Oppose
- #7 HB 2457 Dubbed the Asbestos Trust Claims Transparency Act; The bill creates delays and burdensome hoops for claimants exposed to asbestos and diagnosed with Mesothelioma; The claimant is required to adhere to strict timelines to produce evidentiary forms; **Oppose**
- #8 HB 2365 Parker Amendm't would expand Medicaid (KANCARE) & provide H.Care for 150,000 more Kansans; Support

#9 SB 391 – Est. the Jt. Legis. Transportation Vision Task Force to evaluate the state's Highway & entire X-portation system; Includes naming stakeholders of the task force like the AFL-CIO; The bill requires a report to the entire Legislature in the hopes of restarting projects (jobs); **Support**

#10 HB 2184 – Because death benefits in the Work Comp system have become sorely outdated and have not kept up with inflation, funeral expenses and initial beneficiary payments were inadequate; Legal heirs and dependents will benefit when their loved one is lost on the job; **Support**
