## Issue # & Bill #

#1 HB 2118 Alcala Amendm't; Establishes a Student Loan Credit Program for St. Employees, Also known as the St. Employee Student Loan Repaym't Assistance Act. An opportunity for St. Employees to continue their education; **Support** 

#2 SB 16 – Stogsdill Amendm't; Restores "due-process" rights for Teachers taken away a few years ago; Like any employee, our teachers deserve the right to be treated fairly, to do their job, and without misguided retribution; **Support** 

#3 HB 2154 – Strikes language in Employment Security (Unemployment Benefits) Law that makes School Bus Drivers ineligible for UI Benefits; This group has been singled out and treated differently than many other workers that are eligible for UI Benefits; This fixes the law; **Support** 

#4 HB 2066 – Wolfe-Moore Amendm't; This provides for removal of the bills original language, to then provide language for Medicaid / KanCare Expansion making up to 150,000 low-income Kansans ELIGIBLE for Health Insurance; **Support** 

#5 SB 22 – Ward Amendm't; This amends an already bad tax bill that gives tax breaks to the Multi-National Corporations and the wealthy, so that they would need to pay taxes on overseas investment dollars; **Support** 

#6 SB 22 – Hodge Amendm't; This amends the bad tax bill that gives tax breaks to Multi-National Corporations and the wealthy, to allow reductions in the Food Sales Tax; Kansas is among the highest Sales Tax rates for states; **Support** 

#7 SB 25 – A vote that supported the budget at this juncture meant that our only bargaining chip (the budget) would be gone in our negotiations for passing Medicaid Expansion; Our coalition of Moderates & Democrats held together at this point. **Oppose** 

#8 HB 2209 – This bill seemed to fly in the face & in conflict with the ACA; It allowed the Farm Bureau to seek out providers of an "Associated Health Plan" for their members (if they qualify) and without oversight of the Ks Insurance Dept; They are allowed to exclude members with preexisting conditions and/or for other factors; **Oppose** 

#9 SB 22 – This was the early tax bill Final Action vote giving Tax Breaks to Multi-Nat'l Corporations including Deferred Foreign Income; They attempted to "sweeten" the bill by giving a measly 1% food tax reduction: In comparison, corporations were making out like bandits! Thus, lessening the taxes for Big Business actually increased the burden for working families; **Oppose**
